### CHARTER ROUNDTABLE EVALUATION

Methodology: This is a summary of feedback from young people and attendees who completed an evaluation form after the Roundtable event. 45 people attended the event with 23 providing feedback. 16 young people contributed to the Roundtable with

9 providing feedback.

Roundtable Aims: To launch the Rights Charter to a wide range of partner organisations; to demonstrate best practice in participation; to provide leadership opportunities for the young people and give them a positive experience in sharing their work and views.

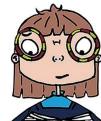
